Music Notes

In 1867, Phillip Brooks composed the text for O Little Town of Bethlehem, reflecting on his journey by horseback from Jerusalem to Bethlehem where he assisted with the midnight service on Christmas Eve. A year later, Lewis Redner, Brooks' organist, set the poem to the tune we most commonly associate with this familiar carol. Audrey Snyder has combined Redner's original tune with the traditional English melody Forest Green, another tune associated with this carol, and produced today's Chancel Choir anthem: The Bethlehem Carol.
