John Rippon first published the text to *How Firm a Foundation* in his collection, *A Selection of Hymns from the Best Authors* in 1787. The actual author remains a mystery although it has been attributed to at least three different people from that era. The text references multiple Old and New Testament scriptures. The familiar tune Foundation is a 19th Century American tune published in both *Sacred Harp* and *Southern Harmony*.
