# **Music Notes**

The tune for today's anthem, Kingsfold, is thought to date back to the Middle Ages and is set to a variety of texts that originated in England, Scotland, and Ireland. The text is by Horatius Bonar, who has been called "the prince of Scottish hymn writers." Bonar wrote more than 600 hymns in his lifetime. Ralph Vaughn Williams first heard the tune in Kingsfold, Sussex, England (thus its name) and was the first to pair the text with the tune.

The setting presented today uses only seven handbells as accompaniment.
