Therefore we gladly join our voices to the song of the church on earth and in heaven:









And now, lest we believe that our praise alone fulfills your purpose, we fall silent and remember him who came because words weren't enough.

Setting our wisdom, our will, our words aside, emptying our hearts, and bringing nothing in our hands, we yearn for the healing, the holding, the accepting, the forgiving that Christ alone can offer.

Merciful God, send now, in kindness. your Holy Spirit to make our sharing in this bread and cup a sharing in Christ's body and blood. And let that same Spirit rest on us, converting us from the patterns of this passing world, until we conform to the shape of him whose food we now share. Amen.3
